Altogether, we won 2 games, drew 3 games and only lost 1. Both teams finished 2<sup>nd</sup> in their league overall and deserved this achievement. Well done all!

## **Class News**

**Year F** In Foundation this week we have been starting to learn about nocturnal animals as part of our Light and Dark theme. In phonics we have learned more new sounds and are making progress in blending and segmenting words and our letter formation. In maths we have been thinking about the 'same' and 'equal'.

**Year 1** This week in Year 1 we have been continuing to describe our secret sky gardens using adjectives. We have looked at the weather in science and made rain gauges. In geography we have carried out some independent research on England and looked at some of the famous human and physical features.

- Year 2** Year 2 have been thinking about what the term 'bullying' means and how we can reach out in school. We have also thought about all the ways we can look after each other and be kind to each other. In PE we have been exploring how to travel along different pathways. In maths we have been discovering related addition and subtraction facts.
- Year 3** This week we have moved on to multiplication in maths. We have been using practical equipment to learn about grouping and arrays. We have begun planning our own Stone Age story in English and will be focusing on how to write a good paragraph. We have continued to make our trousers for the Stone Age Boy, using a running stitch.
- Year 4** A busy week for all of us in Year 4! We have been mastering how to exchange when adding and subtracting 4-digit numbers this week. We have also used junk modelling to create different types of mountain formations. It is amazing what you can create with some tape and cardboard. Friday has been the most exciting day as we joined in with the rest of the school to raise money for Children in Need.
- Year 5** This week Year 5 have been learning about multi step problems using addition and subtraction and in English we have been writing the different sections of Theseus and the Minotaur. We have also started to design our own monster! We have been investigating the properties of materials in science.
- Year 6** Year 6 have been working really hard this week. In English we have been deepening our understanding of our book 'Rain Player'. We have been investigating language features and writing different types of sentences. We have also written both descriptions and newspaper articles about the game of Pok-A-Tok from the story. In maths this week we have started to investigate fractions. We have been finding equivalent fractions, learning how to simplify them and then order and compare them. As historians we have found out about how the landscape of where the Ancient Maya lived affected what they traded. We even tried some trading of our own!
