- Year F In Foundation this week we have been busy learning songs and performing at the Foundation Christmas concert- the children did a great job and thank you to all those who were able to attend. In maths this week, we have been learning number bonds of 5 using lots of different resources, including our snack! We have also been learning to write our tricky words.
- Year 1 This week in Year 1 we have continued our research on England and have learnt lots of new facts which we have put into a book all about England. We have completed descriptions about a new suit for Santa, ready for our friends to have a go at drawing our ideas from our descriptions! We enjoyed forest school this week, where we made hedgehogs, bird feeders and s'mores!
- Year 2 This week, Year 2 should feel incredibly proud of their 3 performances of Prickly Hay. They worked so hard to produce a lovely nativity with songs we will remember and superb acting. When Year 2 have not been performing, we have been learning about places in the United Kingdom that are North, South, East and West of the capital cities. In maths, we have been adding 2 digit numbers together by crossing an extra 10. In science we have been able to identify the stages in the life cycle of both a chicken and a butterfly. - Year 3 This week Year 3 have begun writing their mountain recounts in English. - Year 5 This week, Year 5 have been working really hard during rehearsals for the KS2 Christmas show.
