Please pop along to find FRESH VEG BOXES, CARDS & GIFTS, CAKES and lots of fun prizes to be won at a TOMBOLA.



Class News

Year F In Foundation class this week we have been thinking about ourselves - we have been looking really closely at what we look like, so that we can paint our self-portraits for a class display. We noticed that sometimes we have the same skin, hair or eye colour as our classmates, and sometimes it is different. We have also been thinking about what we like and don't like and how this can be different to other people as well. We explored our feelings with the story 'The Colour Monster' and made some amazing feelings jars to help us recognise and name these emotions when we are feeling them ourselves.

- **Year 1** In Year 1 this week we have been really enjoying our topic of marvellous me. In art the children have been very busy drawing some fantastic self-portraits, thinking carefully about where their features sit on their faces. In geography this week the children have been looking at where they live, we spent some time studying pictures and maps of Wantage thinking about things we recognise.
- Year 2 In Year 2 we have already earned our class treat and are looking forward to a pyjama party next week! We showed superb teamwork and used our learning powers brilliantly in each lesson which meant we have collected 10 marbles in our jar! In maths we have been representing and partitioning two digit numbers in a range of ways and in history we have begun to study the Space race.
- Year 3 This week in Year 3 we have had an extremely exciting week; In English we have been watching the different versions of Charlie and the Chocolate Factory and comparing them with the book. We have also thoroughly enjoyed tasting all the different chocolate and sweets and then thinking of exciting names for our own chocolate bars. In maths we have been recapping numbers to 100 and using part-whole models and dienes to represent numbers. We are also very, very excited about our trip to Cadbury's World on Friday.
- Year 4 have had a great week! We have been deepening our knowledge of the story we learnt in English and have been doing lots of role play activities pretending to be the different animals from the story. This has helped us to learn how to write direct speech correctly. In maths we have been deepening our understanding of place value and have been making numbers up to 10000 using lots of different maths resources. We have been scientists thinking about solids, liquids and gases and geographers learning about some of the different rivers in the UK and the world.
- **Year 5** Year 5 have had a great week. We have started to look at place value in maths and we have been looking at Scott of The Antarctic's diaries in English. In geography we have continued to investigate South America and we have started to consider the differences between human and physical features.
- Year 6 Year 6 have been very busy acting as role models across the school this week. We have taken part in sports leader training and mental health workshops thinking about the roles we can take on across the school. In English we have been focussing on the power of words and writing poems about who we are. In maths, we have been exploring patterns, measuring and cube nets. We all really enjoyed our first swimming session!
