Class News

- Year F** This week we have been taking a closer look at the smallest creatures of our world – mini beasts! The children have enjoyed searching for mini beasts and setting up temporary homes so we can watch them closely. Inspired by some snails we wrote some lovely shape poems in literacy and in maths we have been using ladybirds and butterflies to learn about doubling. We also enjoyed the numeracy day challenges and learning how to work as a team to complete them.
- Year 1** Year 1 really enjoyed celebrating numeracy day this week, we used our problem solving skills and great team work to work on a number of maths challenges. This week we also have been finishing off our pirates topic, we have been creating our own treasure maps and using grid referencing to write instructions to find treasure.
- Year 2** In Year 2 we have been reading a newspaper report about an event that took place in the story of The Wizard of Oz! We will be preparing to write our own newspaper reports about an event of our choice over the next few weeks too! In maths we have begun to tell the time on an analogue clock. See if we can tell you the time at home!
- Year 3** This week we have been looking at right angles, vertical, horizontal, parallel and perpendicular lines in maths. We also loved our Crystal Maze challenges on National Numeracy Day and showed great teamwork and problem-solving skills! In English we have written and edited our accounts of Tutankhamun's last day, and in French we have been learning about the names of different family members.
- Year 4** Year 4 have had a great time! On Friday we had a wonderful World War 2 workshop and got to do lots of activities during the day which an ARP warden would have had to do as part of their duties. This included learning how to carry a stretcher carefully, bandaging a casualty, putting out a fire using a stirrup pump and learning what to do if there was something on fire. We also got to look at loads of artefacts and Leigh, the person running the workshop, said we were one of the most engaged classes he has ever worked with. The rest of the school also got to hear the air raid siren! In maths we have been learning about decimals and have really enjoyed our Crystal Maths challenge on National Numeracy Day.
- Year 5** Year 5 have been working hard writing our stories this week and celebrating National Numeracy Day. We have also been comparing modern day Olympics to the Ancient Olympics in history.
- Year 6** Last Friday we went to Liddington PGL and we had the best time! We all took part in four activities: the giant swing, the zip wire, an obstacle course and raft building. Everyone had a fantastic day and challenged themselves – even Mrs Burbank got Miss Booton (who isn't the biggest fan of heights) on the giant swing! All the adults were so proud of how Year 6 conducted themselves and the attitude they all had towards taking risks. This week we have been creating a PGL display to remember the day, and we've finally finished fractions! Another brilliant week in Year 6.
