Class News

- Year F** In Foundation this week we have enjoyed finding out about Chinese New Year celebrations and loved decorating our classroom and setting up a 'Chinese banquet' in our role play area. We learned how to concertina fold paper to make dragon puppets, and re-enacted a dragon dance with our puppets and colourful scarves. We've also been busy learning more digraphs in phonics and thinking about the composition of number 5 in maths.
- Year 1** This week we have been looking at what a Primary School in Beijing looks like, and have been comparing it to Stockham. We were surprised that they have a longer school day and use their lunchtimes to do their homework! We have also been looking at the story of Chicken Licken, and how traditional tales can have more than one version. We have used this knowledge to retell our own versions.
- Year 2** Year 2 have been exploring subtraction in maths and revisiting the 5 senses and learning about phrases in English. We were very lucky this week to be visited by a parent helper (Ms Mannino - thank you!) who brought in some fab equipment to help us learn more about how we find out about the weather.
- Year 3** We have had an exciting week in our English lessons! The boys trained as warriors while the girls made bread. We then all made and played a game of knucklebones which was a game the children played during the Iron Age. We have ended our English lessons this week by writing a diary recount from an Iron Age child's perspective. We have also started making our steampunk helmets following our design in our art book. Thank you for all the items that were sent in!
- Year 4** This week Year 4 have shown a keen understanding of human teeth including the different types and how they contribute to our digestion. We have continued to use our knowledge of multiplication to explore factor pairs during maths. We are especially proud of the fables we have created during English, each focusing on a moral we have discussed in previous lessons. A great week had by all.
- Year 5** Year 5 have had a great week. We have enjoyed forest school and some have taken part in a writing workshop on Monday. In maths we have continued to look at fractions and how we can recognise that they are equivalent or not. In English we have started writing our narrative poem based on the Highway Man.

Year 6 Year 6 have been really busy this week in English becoming journalists. We have thought about the features of a newspaper report and have interviewed people as if they witnessed the events at The Perfect Pets store in our book. We have learnt how to write effective headlines and are looking forward to using these in our own reports next week. In maths we have deepened our understanding of ratio and proportion and tried to use what we know to answer reasoning questions based on this. In history we learnt all about the plague and how people in the Middle Ages believed this happened and how they tried to treat it.
