Class News

Year F This week in Foundation we have been continuing to learn our letters and sounds in phonics and we are now starting to write short words. In maths, we have been comparing quantities, especially thinking about the word 'equal', as well as continuing to learn about 2D shapes and their properties. Foundation have been in full swing learning songs and actions ready for the Christmas concert and we are very excited about performing this!

- Year 1 This week we enjoyed a trip to the Wantage museum, where we learnt more about King Alfred and some facts about the local area including what fossils can be found on the Ridgeway! We have been adding adjectives to our sentences to describe different settings linked to this term's text, The Secret Sky Garden. In maths we have been using the part-whole model and in science we have been learning about autumn and all the changes it brings.
- Year 2 This week, Year 2 are excited to begin their new history topic of Kings and Queens. We shared what we thought the role of a monarch was and could order some of the Kings and Queens who have ruled England on a timeline. We are now half-way through our Cat and The King story and have really enjoyed creating our own hilarious royal characters. In science, we have been learning about life-cycles and could name each stage of the human life-cycle using the correct scientific language.
- Year 3 This week Year 3 have started working on addition and subtraction in maths, using a formal column method. In English, we have been learning about what fronted adverbials are and how they can improve our writing. We also started our new art topic this week, which is 'Cityscapes'. We began by looking at an incredible artist called Stephen Wiltshire and have produced some drawings of cities in his style. In geography, we learnt which seas surround the U.K and the names and locations of some of the main rivers.
- **Year 4** This week in Year 4 the children really enjoyed their class treat. They had been working hard to collect their 20 marbles. In science we have started our new topic about sound, the children enjoyed finding out about how sound travels and the different parts of the ear. In English we have continued looking at poems and been creating our own descriptive noun phrases.
- Year 5 Year 5 have had a busy week! We have been story mapping the Greek myth Theseus and the Minotaur and learning to step through and tell the story to the rest of the class. In maths we have been learning about multiples and factors and applying them in different contexts. We have started looking at what a system is in computing and we have recapped the different life cycles of amphibians, birds and mammals.
- Year 6 Year 6 have been really busy this week deepening our knowledge of our class book Rain Player. We have been thinking about how the main character would have encouraged and persuaded his friends to join his Pok-a-tok team and we have also written in role as some of the character's from the book. In maths we have been learning how to use BODMAS to help us solve calculations in the right order. As historians we had great fun this week being Maya traders. We learnt about the different areas the Ancient Maya's lived and what they traded in these different regions. We then had a go ourselves. In PE we have also really enjoyed practising the skills of Pok-a-tok- using balloons to make it a little safer for us all!!!
