Class News

- Year F** In Foundation this week we have been looking at the story of Funny Bones, retelling and sequencing the story in our Literacy lessons, thinking about our own skeletons – why we have them and how to keep our bones and bodies healthy. We have also made our own skeleton pictures! We also had fun making some very early Christmas cards which parents will love to see next week! In maths this week we helped Fred the Frog learn to count, which has been lots of fun and produced many giggles.
- Year 1** This week in Year 1 we have been looking at one more and one less in maths. The children have enjoyed showing off their counting skills and using the different resources to show one more or one less. In English we have been looking at how to write the perfect sentence, using a capital letter, finger spaces and full stops.
- Year 2** In Year 2 we have been adding single digit numbers to two digit numbers using the number line and also using renaming. We have worked hard to use our bonds to 10 and the Dienes to help us with this. In history, we have listened to the story of Yuri Gagarin; the first man in space!
- Year 3** This week in English Year 3 have been working really hard on making our writing more exciting to the reader, we have been trying to use interesting language and learning how to 'up level' our work. In maths we have been working hard on comparing objects and numbers, we have been using the language more than, greater than and less than and also refreshing our memories on using the symbols to match. We have also absolutely loved designing our Christmas cards (these will be sent home very shortly!)

- Year 4** Year 4 have been busy this week learning the poem 'The River'. We have used our story telling skills to map it (in a slightly different way to when we did it for a story) and we have also been able to story step it. Ask us at home how much of it we can remember! In maths we have been learning how to order and compare numbers and have learnt the vocabulary of 'ascending' and 'descending'. We have been scientists and experimented with trying to melt chocolate buttons at different temperatures and geographers learning all about the water cycle.
- Year 5** In English this week, Year 5 have been learning about the adventures of explorer Ernest Shackleton. In maths, we have continued our arithmetic topic with a focus on subtraction. We have continued to learn about natural and human landmarks of South America in Geography.
- Year 6** This week, Year 6 have been writing and editing their information texts. In maths, we have been exploring addition and subtraction. In science, we have been exploring how animals are adapted to live in extremely cold environments.
