Class News

- Year F In Foundation this week we have been learning more about nocturnal animals and how they use their senses to help them in the dark. In phonics we've learned more sounds and practiced using them to read and write words we especially liked building robot Rick for the 'r' sound. In maths we have been thinking about 'wholes' and 'parts' and thought about the parts of our bodies making a whole, the parts of a robot making a whole and the parts of each number block making a whole.
- Year 1 This week in English we have been using adjectives to describe characters. In maths we have been looking at the part whole model and fact families up to 10. In geography we have started to learn a new song about continents and which continent the UK is in.
- **Year 2** This week Year 2 have been thinking of the ideas we want to write in our non-chronological reports. We have been exploring how using '10' can help us to add more easily. In geography, we have been learning about different types of settlements.

- **Year 3** In maths we have been working on our 3 times tables. We have been learning about sharing and grouping. The children have been working hard to add the final touches to their Stone Age Boy trousers in their design and technology lessons.
- Year 4 Year 4 have been consolidating their knowledge of addition and subtraction which has been our class focus in maths. Using their expanded knowledge to check their own answers. Our mountains made of junk are finally finished and the only thing left is for the children to present their creations to the class. As a class we thoroughly enjoyed the school visit from Kelly Simm and all joined in the active workshop, even the adults!
- **Year 5** Year 5 have been working hard. We have been looking at addition and subtraction word problems and in English we have been designing our monsters for when we write our own Myths. In DT we had a great day making and baking bread. We have also been learning about materials and their different properties in science.
- Year 6 Year 6 have been really busy this week using our book Rain Player and our knowledge of the Ancient Maya to research how the Maya have left their influence on our lives today. We have found out that without the Maya we might not have chocolate, the number zero and calendars! We are then using this information to help us to write an explanation text all about their legacy. In maths we have learnt lots about fraction! We have been able to convert improper fraction to mixed fractions and vice versa and have been able to add and subtract fractions by finding common denominators. As historians we have investigated how the Maya used the rainforest environment to their full advantage. We have also started to learn our songs for our Christmas concert and have got in the festive spirit!
